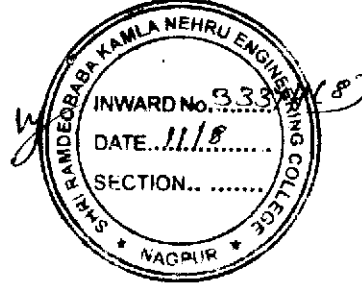

**Chairman's Report for NBA Accreditation Visit to Shri Ramdeobaba Kamla  
Nehru Engg. College, Nagpur 440013 from April 11 to 13, 2008**

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Team Chairman : Prof. A. R. Thakur

Purpose of Visit : Accreditation of the following UG Programme :

- 1) For Under-Graduate Program (Computer Science & Engg.)
- 2) For Under-Graduate Program (Electronics & Communication Engg)
- 3) For Under-Graduate Program (Information Technology)
- 4) For Under-Graduate Program (Industrial Engineering)
- 5) For Post Graduate Program in Computer Application (MCA)

**Chairman's Report:**

Shri Ramdeobaba Kamla Nehru Engg. College is one of the oldest affiliated private engineering colleges in Nagpur. The college is situated currently in 13.1 acres of land and has also acquired 100 acres of more land so as to grow into an institution of national importance, thus underlying the lofty visionary aspect of the management. Although it is run as a minority institution (based on linguistic minority), yet it manages to attract a fair number of good students due to its transparent admission policy linked to CET ranking in its admission under management quota. This, however, necessitates that the trust makes up for the revenue deficit. But they have chosen the more difficult path of earning quality and this leading to a better revenue model.

The college has made substantial budgetary allocation and mostly utilizes the money. Being an ISO 9001-2000 institution the documentation is extensive and decentralization has percolated. An opportunity for growth in leadership exists but stronger motivational aspects need to be focussed.

The interaction with students, faculty, staff, parents and alumni were held in free and frank manner and proved to be immensely fruitful.

Coverage of the syllabus seemed extensive; however, industry interaction needs to be strengthened and coverage beyond syllabus needs immediate attention.

The students have excelled in sports and the college can take pride in the fact that extra curricular activity is quite widespread. This has helped build an ethic based culture and strong personality build up leading to a student representative to represent India in UN as part of the student delegation.

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Being situated in Nagpur with a thriving economy greater emphasis may be placed on turning out entrepreneurs and utilization of locked resources for the purpose may be an answer. This might also help the teachers to work for more consultancy and the scope for involving technical staff in the process might remove their discontent in term of non-payment of arrears or non-availability of skill upgradation opportunities.


For the faculty implementation of QIP is the need of the hour. The results of implementation of a policy are well documented.

The college in its desire to reach the cherished goal of autonomy must start using the limited opportunities that exist currently.

The hostel and canteen facilities can certainly be spruced up. One major area of concern is lack of R&D orientation. This is compounded by lack of professional developmental activities. The students need better guidance for participation in competitive examination. Power back up needs immediate attention. Budget provisions for R&D activity should be a priority. No. of Ph.Ds is principally from Science. Like many other institutions, retention of faculty is poor. Incentives like book award and ability to go to seminar, symposium, etc. just as a participant should be encouraged.

Only four undergraduate programmes could be recommended for a three year accreditation.

MCA program was found to be not so.
