

Independence Week - Amrit Mahotsav

Date: 10/08/2021 - 14/08/2021

The celebration of Independence Day signifies the solidarity of the citizens towards the nation. The series of events organized by the government of India to celebrate the 75th anniversary of India's independence was based on public participation and revolved around five themes- the freedom struggle, ideas, achievements, actions and resolve at 75. This year, NSS Unit, RCOEM, celebrated "Swadheenta Ka Amrit Mahotsav" for one complete week starting from August 10 to August 14.

On August 10, the players who won a medal for India in Tokyo Olympics 2021 were admired by posting stories about their significant contribution in their respective sports on our social media handle. The athletes were- Neeraj Chopra (Gold in Javelin Throw), Ravi Kumar Dahiya (Silver in Wrestling), Mirabai Chanu (Silver in Weight Lifting), P. V. Sindhu (Bronze in Women's Singles Badminton), Lovlina Borgohain (Bronze in Women's Welterweight Boxing), Bajarang Punia (Bronze in Men's Wrestling) and Indian Men's Hockey Team (Bronze in Hockey). Also, stories of the players who played exceptionally well but failed were posted which included Saurabh Chaudhary (Men's 10m Air Pistol), Kamalpreet Kaur (Women's Discus Throw), Aditi Ashok (Women's individual Stroke Play), Deepak Punia (Wrestling) and the Women's Hockey team. The stories of the Indian medalists from the 2016 Summer Paralympic Games were also posted which included Devendra Jhajharia (Gold in Javelin Throw), Mariyappan Thangavelu (Gold in Men's high jump), Deepa Malik (Silver in Shot put), and Varun Singh Bhati (Bronze in high jump). It was a moment of great honor and pride for RCOEM when Sir Varun Singh Bhati, reposted the story.

The stories of Instagram on August 11 depicted a nectar of inspiration from freedom fighters and a salute to all these unsung heroes of India. The stories included the contribution of the tribal warrior 'Birsa Munda', the fierce knight 'Ram Prasad Bismil', the silent hero 'Potti Sreeramulu', the revolutionary fighter 'Batukeshwar Dutt' and Manipur ki rani 'Rani Gaidinliu'.

On August 12, the unit spread the message of 'Atma Nirbhar Bharat' by posting stories mentioning people who contributed to making India self-reliant in various sectors, inspiring others to do the same. The contributions of Perala Manasa Reddy (a student who turns sewage pipes into low-cost homes for the needy), Samir Jamatia (a tribal entrepreneur who exports 600 kgs of Bamboo leaf tea to the UK and Europe), Tukaram Gunjal (a farmer who maximized profits with organic farming), Navin Mali (a Gujarat farmer who built an innovative solar- powered tractor) and terracotta artisans of Asharikandi (who keep the ancient craft of Harappan Civilization alive) were covered.

The stories on August 13 introduced some ideas and resolutions such as alternatives of plastic, development of medical devices, e-waste management, crop residue management, and water recycling technologies for a better India. On this day, the NSS Unit, RCOEM participated in the event **Fit India Freedom Run Campaign** along with all the NSS units of all the universities. The volunteers prepared a short video and spread it to encourage and promote fitness culture and the spirit of sportsmanship among youth. A short video to generate enthusiasm and infuse patriotism among youth and people, in general, was also prepared. The volunteers also made comic-style posters and spread awareness about the two objectives productively.

On August 14, stories on the Instagram handle mentioned some rare facts about India to acquaint people with its greatness and pride. The NSS volunteers sang the national anthem together on Zoom (an online platform) to show respect towards the brave souls and posted the video on the official YouTube channel on August 15. Nearly 1.5 crore Indians contributed to singing and recording the national anthem and the NSS Unit being one of them, was honored by a certificate. Thus, the celebration of Independence week ended with great zeal and vigor. 51 NSS Volunteers participated in these activities.

Date: 07/09/2021 to 19/09/2021





It expresses the essence of democratic living, the need for selfless service, appreciation of the other man's point of view, and also a consideration for fellow human beings. The cardinal principle of the NSS program is to get a sense of involvement in the task of nation-building. The NSS Foundation Day program was commemorated using a digital platform i.e. Google Meet.

The event commenced at 02:00 pm in the presence of honorable chief guest Shri Milindji Pathak (Member of 'Board of Studies' Electrical Engineering GHRIET, Nagpur), Dr. Amit Anurag (NSS Program Officer), and Prof. Saket Kanetkar. Code Heist - The Social Hackathon

Date: 02/10/2021 - 20/10/2021

Platform: Google Meet

Various hackathon competitions are conducted globally to address real life business problems or social issues. This year NSS Unit, RCOEM took the initiative to organize a similar competition to find some inventive solutions for the current social issues and contribute in creating a better future for the society. The name of the event was **Code Heist - The Social Hackathon**. An event where participants were indulged in brainstorming problem statements based on real life necessities of the society. A total of 75 teams participated in the event.

As a part of a brainstorming session / introductory session (held on 02/10/2021), five problem statements were presented before the teams, out of which the teams selected the one that they wish to solve over the course of competition. The problem statements required participants to provide solutions to health issues in rural areas, pedestrian safety, virtual health assistant, face mask detection and social distancing. The event consisted of 5 rounds. The 1st round (held on 03/10/2021), "Buckle Up", was a proposal submission round. The astonishing start of the event made participants even more enthusiastic and committed.

In all, 29 teams appeared for the 2nd round (held on 06/10/2021) which was the "Kick Off Session". In this round, participating teams were asked to present their basic idea and approach towards the problem statement. The judges for this round, assistant professors of RCOEM, Dr. Shailendra Aote, Prof. Madhuri Tayal, Prof. Aarti Karandikar and Prof. Khushboo Khurana guided the participants for their project.

This was followed by the 3rd round (held on 16/10/2021), "Run Time Terror" which was a code submission round. 25 teams were selected for this round. It was expected to code for the software part of the chosen problem statement in the given time limit of ten days.

Further, 13 teams qualified for the next round. In the 4th round (held on 17/10/2021) of the event i.e., "Knockout Geeks", the teams had to explain their problem statement and the code submitted by them in the previous round. Our judges, Mr. Tanmay Shirbhate (Software Engineer in ZS Associates), Mr. Deepak Jha (Product Manager at Stealth Startup) and Mr. Amit Prithyani (FrontEnd Specialist, YouPal Group, Sweden) also gave their valuable suggestions for the betterment of each project and guided them on how they can improve their product. The round gave each team an opportunity to discuss their ideas with industry experts. It allowed them to enhance the quality of their product through constructive feedback.

The selected six teams moved further to the decisive round (held on 20/10/2021), i.e., "Final Pitch", which expected an updated version of the product made by participants, inculcating suggestions given by the judges in previous rounds. The judges for the final round were Mr. Deepak Jha and Mr. Amit Prithyani. And the anchoring was done by NSS volunteers, Ms. Kalyani Trivedi and Ms. Deepti Dekate.

Consequently, the first position was secured by Bug Hunters(T-41), who provided solution for the health technology in rural areas, followed by Coding Geeks(T-33) on second position, who provided solution for face mask detection and social distancing and the third winning team was

Bhagwan Bharose(T-52), who provided solution for the pedestrian safety. Accordingly, they secured rewards of ₹3000, ₹2000 and ₹1000 along with a shoutout on the official instagram handle of NSS Unit, RCOEM. Overall, the event nurtured the potential and gave all the participants a platform to showcase their innovative ideas & projects and improve further to achieve heights of success in this competitive world. The event was concluded by Ms. Maahi Kanojiya (NSS volunteer) presenting the vote of thanks, expressing gratitude towards judges of the event, participants and organizing team for making this event successful.

Thus, organizing this social hackathon helped to develop a creative space for enthusiastic coders to meet, learn and work together and aided the unit to promote solutions to social issues and bring sustainable changes in the society.

Voter's ID Registration Drive

"Voting is not only our right - it is our duty towards the nation."

The Indian voter ID card is an identity document issued by the Election Commission of India to adult domiciles of India who have reached the age of 18, which primarily serves as an identity proof for Indian citizens while casting their ballot in the country's municipal, state, and national elections.

This year, NSS Unit, RCOEM organized a Voter's ID registration drive under the scheme of SVEEP (Systematic Voter's Education and Electoral Participation program) for the students of Shri Ramdeobaba College of Engineering and Management who do not have their voter ID. The registration drive was conducted on 21/11/2021 and commenced at 12 pm under the guidance of Dr. Renuka Nafdey ma'am, the representative of the Electoral Literacy Club. The registration booth was set up and managed by two government officials at college premises. The NSS volunteers spread awareness for the drive by making flyers and posting them on social media from 17/11/2021. A total number of 193 students registered themselves through the Google form and 110 out of them participated in the drive, consisting of 65 boys and 45 girls.


"Make your voice a potent weapon to create a beautiful earth, one without AIDS."



House of Laws

"The health of a democratic society is measured by the quality of functions performed by private citizens."

This year, the NSS Unit of Shri Ramdeobaba College of Engineering and Management took the initiative to introduce Indian democracy and laws to engineering students through an event called "House of Laws", conducted under PRERNA 14.0. The event stretched over two days and consisted of four rounds, each based on a pillar of democracy. Around 81 teams, of four participants each, participated in the event.

The first round was based on the first pillar of democracy, i.e., 'The Executive', in which the participants were given a set of three question papers. The questions were related to various domains, which included general knowledge of Indian history, geography, laws, politics, and economics. The response to the round was overwhelming. A total of 40 teams qualified for the next round, which was based on the second pillar of democracy, i.e., 'The Judiciary'. In this round, each team was allotted a hypothetical case and was asked to research and debate with the opponent team. The judges for the round were Adv. Ishaan Tambi (Practicing Advocate at Bombay High Court, Nagpur Bench) and Adv. Kiran Bisani (Junior Advocate at High Court and State Commission). The participating teams were judged on their professional behavior, knowledge of laws, communication skills, and arguments made during the court proceeding. This was followed by the third round, which was again based on a pillar of democracy - 'The Legislature'. A total of 14 teams competed in this round, with each team assigned a ministry. The teams were asked to provide solutions, amendments, or new schemes to the flaws in pre-existing laws of the particular ministry. The third round of the event was judged by Ms. Ankita Sengupta (Junior Researcher, Dept. of Political Science, Nagpur University).

The final round consisted of six teams, which was based on the fourth pillar, 'The Media'. In this round, the participating teams were expected to answer the questions of the opponent teams as well as the audience. The chief guest for the final round was Adv. Nandesh S. Deshpande (Assistant Solicitor General of India, Bombay Highcourt, Nagpur Bench). He was facilitated with a memento and a sapling by the hands of Prof. Saket Kanetkar. The three top teams were selected as winners and awarded with a book.

It was a time-limited event with government financing to empower youth, where all the participants were given problem statements based on the real-world problems in villages to boost their problem-solving and innovation skills. The event stretched over three days and consisted of three rounds. Around teams of four participants each participated in the event.

The first round of PRAYAS, the 'Brainstorming session' was conducted on 21st March. In this round, all the team members were instructed to brainstorm and go through at least 3 research papers related to the assigned problem statement and propose a feasible, budget friendly solution to the problem using engineering solutions and also prepare the market survey documents of their respective topics. A time limit of 7 minutes was given to each team to discuss their problem statements with their respective mentors. The 20 shortlisted teams were qualified for the second round, which was the 'Presentation round'. Each team was given 7 minutes for their presentation and the remaining 3 minutes was a Q&A session with our panelists. 
