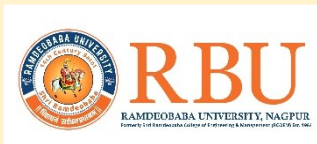

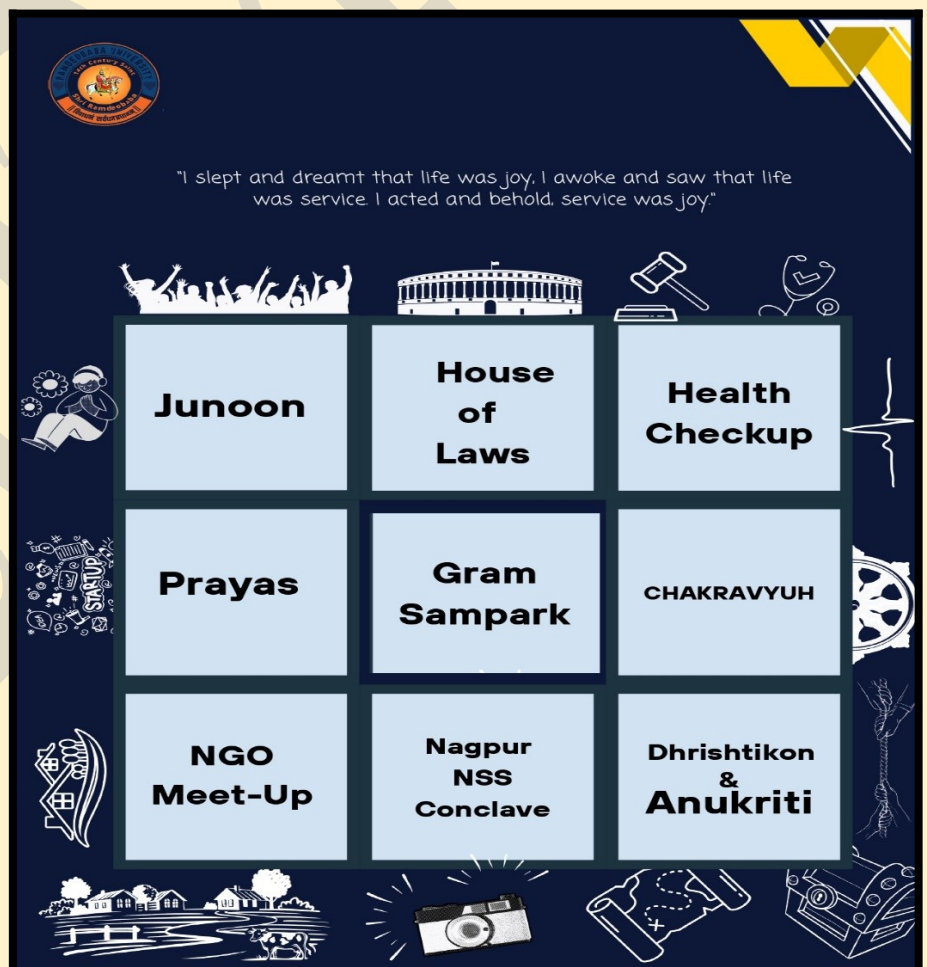

PRERNA 17.0

PRERNA 17.0, a week-long socio-cultural event under the theme '**SANSKRUTIK SANGAM**', celebrated the confluence of diverse cultures in India. Organized by the NSS Unit of RCOEM, the event aimed to recognize and honour the rich cultural heritage of the nation. Held from **February 22nd to February 24th and 2nd March, 2025**, PRERNA 17.0 offered a platform for engaging activities that inspired, educated, and involved participants from all walks of life. The event succeeded in creating an environment for learning, reflection, and meaningful contribution to society.

INAUGURATION & INTERACTIVE SESSION WITH AIR VICE MARSHAL SHRI. SURYAKANT CHAFEKAR:

The NSS Unit of Ramdeobaba University, Nagpur successfully inaugurated Prerna 17.0 on 22nd February, 2025 with great enthusiasm and participation. The event was graced by esteemed dignitaries and commenced with the inauguration ceremony, setting a vibrant tone for the initiative. **The program was honoured to have Retired Air Vice Marshal Shri Suryakant Chafekar as the Chief Guest. Along with him, other distinguished guests included: Dr. S.S. Mantha (Chancellor of RBU), Dr. Manoj Chandak (Principal of RCOEM), Dr. Amit Anurag, (NSS Unit Program Officer), Dr. A. Bharti (Director of School of Humanities & Sciences).**

The inauguration commenced with the traditional lighting of the lamp, symbolizing wisdom and knowledge. This was followed by an insightful address by Dr. S.S. Mantha, Chancellor of Ramdeobaba University, who emphasized the significance of NSS in shaping responsible citizens and fostering community service. A total of **75 NSS Volunteers** were present for the event.

Agrawal, gave a brief detail about Prerna 17.0, a week-long event comprising various activities such as House of Laws, Chakravayuh, Prayas, Drishtikon, Anukriti, Junoon, and Gram Sampark. Their presentation provided the attendees with an overview of the diverse events aimed at fostering creativity, leadership, and social responsibility.

The Chief Guest, Retired Air Vice Marshal Shri Suryakant Chafekar, then took the stage and delivered an inspiring speech, sharing his experiences and encouraging students to contribute actively to society through NSS initiatives.

The event concluded with a formal vote of thanks delivered by Dr. Amit Anurag, NSS Unit Program Officer, who expressed gratitude towards the dignitaries, faculty members, and students for their support and participation. To enrich the event further, an engaging interactive session was conducted, where students had the opportunity to ask questions to the Chief Guest. Shri Suryakant Chafekar enthusiastically shared his experiences, wisdom, and guidance, leaving the students inspired and motivated.



CHAKRAVYUH – the ultimate strength of & strategy:

Introduction:

Chakravyuh which took place on 23rd February 2025 was an exciting event at Prerna 17.0, designed to test teamwork, coordination, agility, and quick thinking. **80 NSS Volunteers** were present for the event. Teams competed across multiple rounds, each featuring unique and challenging tasks. The event aimed to identify the team that could successfully complete all challenges first, showcasing their physical abilities, mental agility, and strategic thinking. The team that completed all the tasks the fastest emerged as the winner. The event details are given below:

Round 1

Student's participating in various races

Task 1: Sponge Relay Race

Teams transferred water between buckets using a sponge in a relay format. The team transferring the most water in the least time won.

Task 2: Sack Race + Wrong Answers Only

Two players raced in sacks and with sticks, while a third answered questions incorrectly in a humorous "Wrong Answers Only" game.

Round 2

Task 1: Blindfolded Three-Legged Obstacle Race

Two blindfolded teammates navigated an obstacle course with legs tied, guided verbally by a third teammate.

Task 2: Tyre Aim Challenge

After the obstacle race, two teammates attempted to throw a tyre onto a cone. The round ended when one succeeded; total time was recorded.

Round 3: Tag Rugby

Teams played a 15-minute tag rugby match with relaxed rules. Points were scored by tagging and ball control, emphasizing teamwork and strategy.



Conclusion:

Chakravyuh at Prerna 17.0 was a standout event, blending excitement, teamwork, and friendly competition. With rounds testing physical endurance, mental agility, and strategy, it drew enthusiastic participation and ran smoothly throughout. The final tag rugby match was a highlight, showcasing teamwork and sportsmanship. Chakravyuh left a lasting impression and firmly cemented its place as a festival favourite.



PRAYAS – Turning ideas into impact:

Introduction:



Prayas, held at the Digital Tower in the RBU Campus on 22nd and 24th February 2025, was a key event under PRERNA 17.0 that provided a platform for teams to propose innovative solutions to significant social issues. The competition aimed to foster creativity, feasibility, and impact in addressing real-world problems. It was conducted in two rounds, where teams presented their solutions both informally and formally, using presentations and prototypes. The team with the most creative, feasible, and impactful solution was awarded the top honour, making PRAYAS a highlight of PRERNA 17.0. A total of **15 NSS Volunteers** were present for the event.

Round 1: Round 1 was divided into two parts:

1. **Survey Task:** Each team was required to create a Google Form centered around their chosen social problem. They then conducted a survey among their peers to gather data relevant to their proposed solution.
2. **Oral Presentation:** Teams presented their solutions informally, explaining their approach and initial thoughts on how to address the social issue they had chosen.

All six teams successfully advanced to the next round based on their presentation and survey results. The judges for Round 1 were Prashil Bhattad, Yash Ghoderao, Mahak Arora, Nandani Sanghi, and Saket Karwa.

Round 2 – Final Presentation (24th February):

In the second round, teams presented their solutions in a more formal setting. This time, they used PowerPoint presentations (PPTs) and prototypes to showcase detailed analysis, feasibility studies, and the potential impact of their ideas. The presentations were designed to provide a comprehensive view of their approach, highlighting how their solution could realistically address the identified social problem. The judge for Round 2 was Professor Himanshu M. Shukla.



Conclusion:

PRAYAS proved to be a successful initiative under PRERNA 17.0, offering students the opportunity to brainstorm and develop innovative solutions to real-world social challenges. The structured format of the competition encouraged participants to refine their ideas, conduct thorough research, and present practical implementations of their solutions. The event highlighted the importance of creative problem-solving, teamwork, and critical thinking. The enthusiasm, dedication, and hard work displayed by all teams contributed to the overall success of Prayas, making it a truly inspiring initiative within PRERNA 17.0. 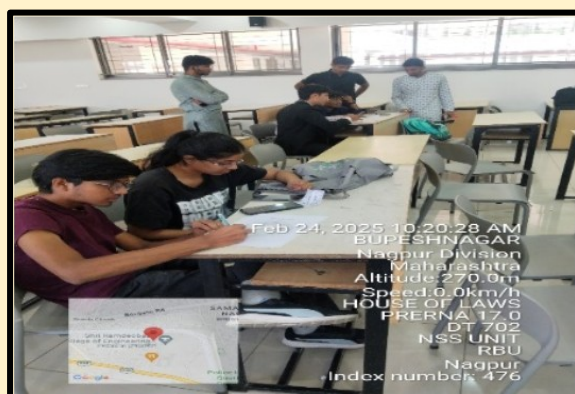
among the participants.

HOUSE OF LAW – *argue, investigate, conquer:*

Introduction:

House of Law, conducted by the NSS as part of PRERNA 17.0, was a three-round event held on 22nd and 24th February 2025 at the Digital Tower, RBU Campus. The event focused on competitions and games related to the three main components of the Indian Government: The Executive, Legislature, and Judiciary. Through this interactive platform, participants gained insights into the workings of these components while engaging in challenging and thought-provoking activities. A total of **15 NSS Volunteers** were present for the event.

Round 1:

The first round featured a quiz competition in which questions with four options were displayed. Participating teams used a buzzer connected to a circuit to register their answers. Points were awarded for correct answers, and these points carried forward into the next round. The judge for Round 1 was Mr. Devanshu Narnoliya, Head House of Law. The teams that participated in Round 1 were Learners 2.0, Verbal Vanguards, Indiggas, and Team Kurukshetra.

Round 2 – 24th February:

In this round, teams participated in a Budget Challenge. They were given a cumulative budget, the sum of their points from Round 1 and Rs 3000 Cr. Teams were assigned an Indian state and a Budget Muster, which outlined specific parameters for allocating their in-hand budget. The judges reviewed the teams' budget allocations, and the top two teams advanced to the final round. The judges for Round 2 were Ms. Nupur Gour, Head House of Law, and Mr. Devanshu Narnoliya, Head House of Law. The teams that participated in Round 2 were Learners 2.0, Verbal Vanguards, Indiggas, and Team Kurukshetra.

Round 3 (Final Round) – 24th February:

The final round of Nyaya Summit was graced by Dr. Vinod Asudani, Professor of Humanities department at RBU, the Chief Guest, who also served as the judge for this round. This round consisted of two sub-rounds. The first sub-round featured a Parliamentary discussion on the topic "**One Nation-One Election**," where the two finalist teams were divided into the ruling party and the opposition. The second sub-round was a debate on the topic "Should judges be elected instead of appointed?"

Dr. Asudani provided valuable insights on the teams' performances and shared his expertise on the complexities of the Indian democratic system. His participation greatly enhanced the event's learning experience. The judges for Round 3 were Dr. Vinod Asudani (Chief Guest and Judge) and Mr. Devanshu Narnoliya, Head Nyaya Summit.



Conclusion:

House of Law, conducted by the NSS Unit as part of PRERNA 17.0, was a great success and left a lasting impression on both the participants and the audience. The dignitaries appreciated the smooth organization of the event by the Heads and Co-Heads, as well as the high quality of the challenges posed in each round. The event effectively showcased the functions of the Executive, Legislature, and Judiciary, fostering a deeper understanding of the Indian Government's components. DRISHTIKON – the ultimate quest:

The event "DRISHTIKON" was conducted on 22nd February 2025 by the NSS Unit of RBU during PRERNA 17.0. It was a thrilling and educational competition that showcased the cultural diversity of India. The event involved teams representing four regions: North, East, West, and South. Each team participated in various cultural challenges, earning points and collecting stamps along the way. To complete the game, teams needed to accomplish multiple tasks, collect tickets, and earn stamps from each of the four regions. A total of **15 NSS Volunteers** were present for the event.

Round Overview: The event was designed to be a competitive yet fun way to experience and learn about the rich cultural diversity of India. Each team followed a set game sequence, moving from one region to another and completing tasks to earn points.

Game Tasks:

1. Cultural Circle Quiz:

Participants answered questions by using circle rings representing various options. Correct answers earned points and tested their knowledge of different cultural aspects.

2. Tradition Sorting Challenge:

Glasses with images of Indian traditions were placed on a table. Participants identified and sorted them according to the tradition they represented.

3. Cultural Performance:

Participants replicated or performed tasks related to different Indian cultural practices, showcased through a visual display.

4. Spice & Region Discovery:

Participants identified spices used in various dishes and the regions or states from which those dishes originated.

5. Sell & Succeed Challenge:

Participants were given a product to sell. They had to bring back a buyer to earn points for completing the task successfully.

6. Memory Match-Up:

A sequence of 5-6 items was shown for 5 seconds. Participants then had to rearrange them in the correct order. This challenge was repeated three times with different sequences.

7. Info Challenge Quiz:

Participants were presented with a chart filled with detailed information, followed by questions. Correct answers earned points, while incorrect answers resulted in point deductions.

8. Map Mastery Quest:

Two maps (correct and incorrect) were provided. Participants had to select the correct map to earn points. If they selected the wrong map, they were sent to a different location where they completed a task to earn additional points.

9. Mystery Advantage Box:

A box filled with chits containing advantages or disadvantages was presented. Participants had to complete a task to earn the benefits or avoid penalties related to the chit.

10. Ticket Collection:

Participants collected tickets by completing challenges in each region. A stamp was awarded for each successfully completed task, and once all stamps were collected across all regions, the game was completed.

The game concluded once participants completed all the tasks across the four regions and collected all the stamps. The team with the most points was declared the winner.

Conclusion:

The event *Drishtikon*, conducted by the NSS Unit of RBU during PRERNA 17.0, proved to be a resounding success. The well-executed organization of the event, led by the Heads and Co-Heads, was praised by both the dignitaries and participants. The quality and variety of the cultural challenges helped participants immerse themselves in the traditions, food, and culture of different states across India. The event not only tested participants' knowledge but also encouraged team collaboration and cultural appreciation.

Computer Learning Centre: NSS Unit Initiative

SAHYOG was a skill development program under the NSS unit of RBU, aimed at teaching basic computer skills to underprivileged children. The program



provided structured training to enhance digital literacy and empower students with essential technological knowledge.

Operations

SAHYOG classes were conducted twice a week:

- **Saturday:** 3:30 PM – 5:30 PM
- **Sunday:** 11:00 AM – 1:00 PM

Enrolment Process

NSS volunteers visited several underprivileged areas and distributed enrolment forms. A total of 65 responses were received, reflecting strong interest from the community.

Inauguration and First Session (11th & 12th January 2025)

The first SAHYOG class was conducted on 11th January as an introductory session to establish communication between students and volunteers. After the session, students were taken to the Swami Vivekananda Art Gallery on the college campus, providing them with inspiration and insight into Swami Vivekananda's teachings and philosophy. This visit encouraged them to strive for knowledge and self-improvement.

On 12th January, the SAHYOG class was officially inaugurated in the presence of Dr. Amit Anurag, followed by the distribution of chocolates and pens to the students.

Curriculum

The SAHYOG syllabus covered essential computer skills, including:

- **UNIT 1:** Computer Basics (Parts, Types, Features)
- **UNIT 2:** Introduction to Operating Systems
- **UNIT 3:** MS Paint and Notepad
- **UNIT 4:** Microsoft Office (Word, PPT, Excel)
- **UNIT 5:** Internet and Web Browsing
- Other Fundamental Computer Skills

Teaching Methodology

Each session included:

- **1.5 hours** of study (theory and practical lessons)
- **30 minutes** of games (to keep students engaged and interactive)

Challenges Faced

Some sessions were disrupted due to functions near the Sahyog room and other NSS events, leading to a decline in student attendance. Efforts were made to ensure consistency and encourage regular participation.

Assessment and Performance

After completing three modules, a test was conducted, and most students performed well, showing significant progress in their learning.
